A guide to the Subway



Current at April 2010

The Subway provides a fast and reliable way of getting around Glasgow's city centre. During peak times there's a Subway train every four minutes calling at each of the 15 stations on the double circular route north and south of the river.

Park and Ride facilities are offered at three of the stations and there are direct links to the national rail network at Partick and Buchanan Street stations.

It's the world's third oldest Subway, opened in 1896 after only London and Budapest. Today, it's one of the most punctual systems in Europe and is a crucial link in Glasgow's transport infrastructure.

Timetable

The Subway operates every 4 minutes during morning and evening peak periods and service frequencies are varied to suit demand off peak.

A special timetable operates on public holidays.

Passengers intending to travel on the first or last trains are advised to arrive 5 minutes before the advertised departure time to allow time to purchase tickets and descend to platform level.

Subway booking offices are staffed at all times and all tickets are available at any Subway station. You can, however, purchase a single or return ticket from one of the automatic ticket machines at most stations.

10 and 20 multi-journey tickets can be used at any time of the day and there is no time limit in validity. Ticket barrier machines display journeys remaining on your ticket

You can now buy 10 and 20 multi-journey tickets online at www.spt.co.uk.

Season tickets can be used at any time of the day, give unlimited travel and are available on a 7 day basis.

Discovery tickets give unlimited travel for one day and can be used at any time of day.

Park and Ride

Avoid city centre congestion and leave your car at one of the car parks reserved for Subway passengers. You'll find you could make big savings compared to city centre parking charges. You can Park and Ride at the following stations:

- Kelvinbridge - 150 parking spaces
- Bridge Street - 159 parking spaces
- Shields Road - 800 parking spaces

All car parks are equipped with closed-circuit TV surveillance.
