1. Object of report

To notify the Committee of the temporary subsidised local bus contracts awarded utilising delegated powers.

2. Background

It is necessary to award temporary subsidised local bus contracts as allowed for in the Scheme of Delegations to react to commercial bus market changes and ensure that, where budget allows, service continuity to the travelling public continues. Appendix 1 details the temporary contracts that have been in place since April 2017.

Tendering processes continue to ensure these are replaced on a sustainable basis.

3. Committee action

The Committee is recommended to note the contracts awarded, utilising delegated powers, and thus ensuring that gaps in the public transport network arising from commercial local bus market changes are provided for.
