1. Minute of previous meeting

The minute of the meeting of 25 January 2008 (issued) was submitted and approved as a correct record.

2. Revenue monitoring report as at 1 March 2008

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There was submitted a report (issued) of 18 March 2008 by the Assistant Chief Executive (Business Support)/Treasurer,

- (1) reminding members that the Partnership had approved a revenue budget for 2007/08 of £45.376m;
- (2) appending the revenue monitoring report for the period to 1 March 2008 (period 12); and
- (3) informing members that, based on the information to date, an underspend of £49,000 was forecast at this stage and all expenditure heads would be monitored closely to ensure that the projected underspend was achieved.

After consideration and having heard Mrs. Davidson and Mr. Wylie in answer to members' questions, the committee noted the terms of the report.

3. Capital programme monitoring and proposed amendments and additions – as at 1 March 2008

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There was submitted a report (issued) of 13 March 2008 by the Assistant Chief Executive (Transport & Strategy),

- (1) providing a financial analysis of the capital programme budget and actual spend as at 1 March 2008 (period 12) in summary by service and in detail by project which highlighted an actual spend to date of £38.906m compared to a revised profile expenditure to be incurred by the end of period 12 of £41.328m;
- (2) highlighting the following projects which had been selected for detailed reporting:-

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- GPS location equipment for SPT secured services vehicles;
- Adaptable bus project;
- Subway modernisation;
- West of Scotland Conurbation Public Transport Study;
- Glasgow Airport Rail Link Phase 2;
- Crossrail:
- Croy Park and Ride;
- Motherwell Transport Interchange;
- Partick Interchange redevelopment; and
- Property acquisition.
- (3) appending a list of various proposed amendments to the capital programme which, if approved, would result in an anticipated outturn spend of £51.548m at the end of the financial year;
- (4) advising members
 - (a) that additional funding had been sought and utilised from current reserve balances and in a grant funding swap arrangement with other RTPs.
 - (b) that the funding received in 2007/08 of over £3m from the other RTPs would be returned to them in future financial years; and

After having heard Mrs Davidson in further explanation and in answer to members' questions, the committee approved the recommendations at (5) above.

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4. SPT Involvement in the North Channel Partnership

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There was submitted a report (issued) of 12 March 2008 by the Assistant Chief Executive (Transport & Strategy),

(1) informing members

- (a) of the purpose and membership of the North Channel Partnership, which had been established in 1999 and comprised public and commercial organisations with a view to improving transport links between Scotland and Northern Ireland;
- (b) that the quality of the road and rail infrastructure between Stranraer/Cairnryan and the central belt was of concern to the North Channel Partnership due to the impact this had on the competitiveness of the ports in comparison to those ports served by alternative sea crossings from Northern Ireland to Wales and North West England; and
- (c) that an invitation to become part of the North Channel Partnership Steering Group had been received; and

(2) explaining

- (a) that SPT's Regional Transport Strategy (RTS) recognised the need to improve connectivity to Stranraer/Cairnryan as a strategic priority; and
- (b) that the terms of reference of the North Channel Partnership which sought to enhance the safety, quality and efficiency of road and rail connections were consistent with the RTS.

After discussion, the committee agreed

- (i) that SPT accept the invitation to become part of the North Channel Partnership Steering Group; and
- (ii) that the Chair (or substitute) and one official be authorised to attend meetings and the annual conference of the Partnership.

5. Exchange visit with Greater Toronto Transport Authority (Metrolinx)

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There was submitted a report (issued) of 28 February 2008 by the Chief Executive,

- (1) informing members that representatives of the Greater Toronto Transport Authority (Metrolinx) had met with the Chair and SPT representatives in November 2007 to discuss a number of issues, including organisational structure and approaches, infrastructure funding and the wider issue of planning and developing transport within a growing conurbation;
- advising members that Metrolinx had invited representatives from SPT to visit the Greater Toronto area to discuss further solutions and approaches; and

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(3) recommending that the invitation be accepted.

After discussion, the committee agreed that the Chair (or substitute) and one officer participate in an exchange visit.

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
