Bus Station Access Guide

Introduction

Partick bus station is a modern purpose-built station with 6 bus stances.

Location

The station is located just off Dumbarton Road beside Partick Subway and rail station building.

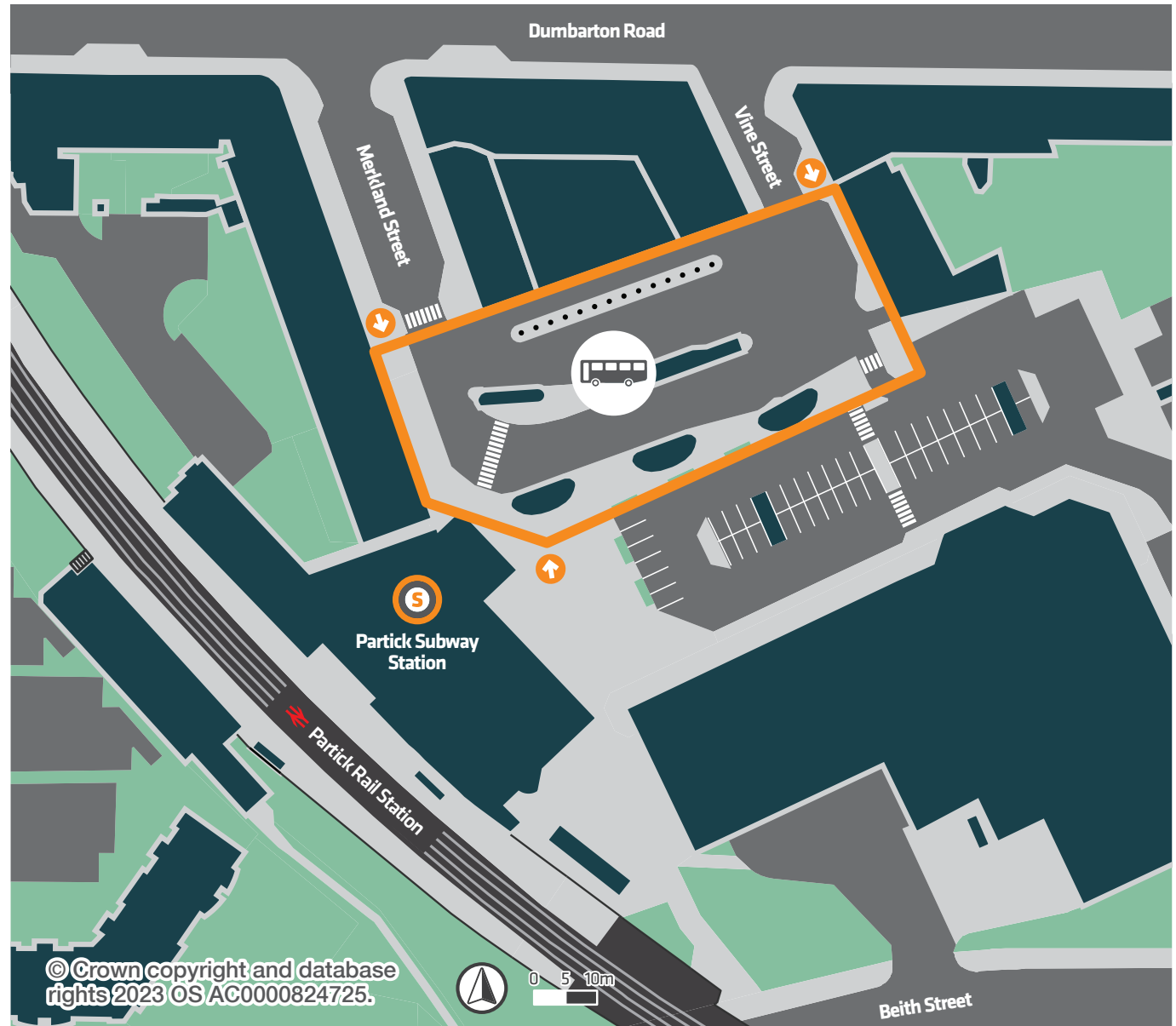
The bus station is bordered by Morrisons carpark to the south. Vine Street and Merkland Street feed into the station from Dumbarton Road, to the north.

Opening hours

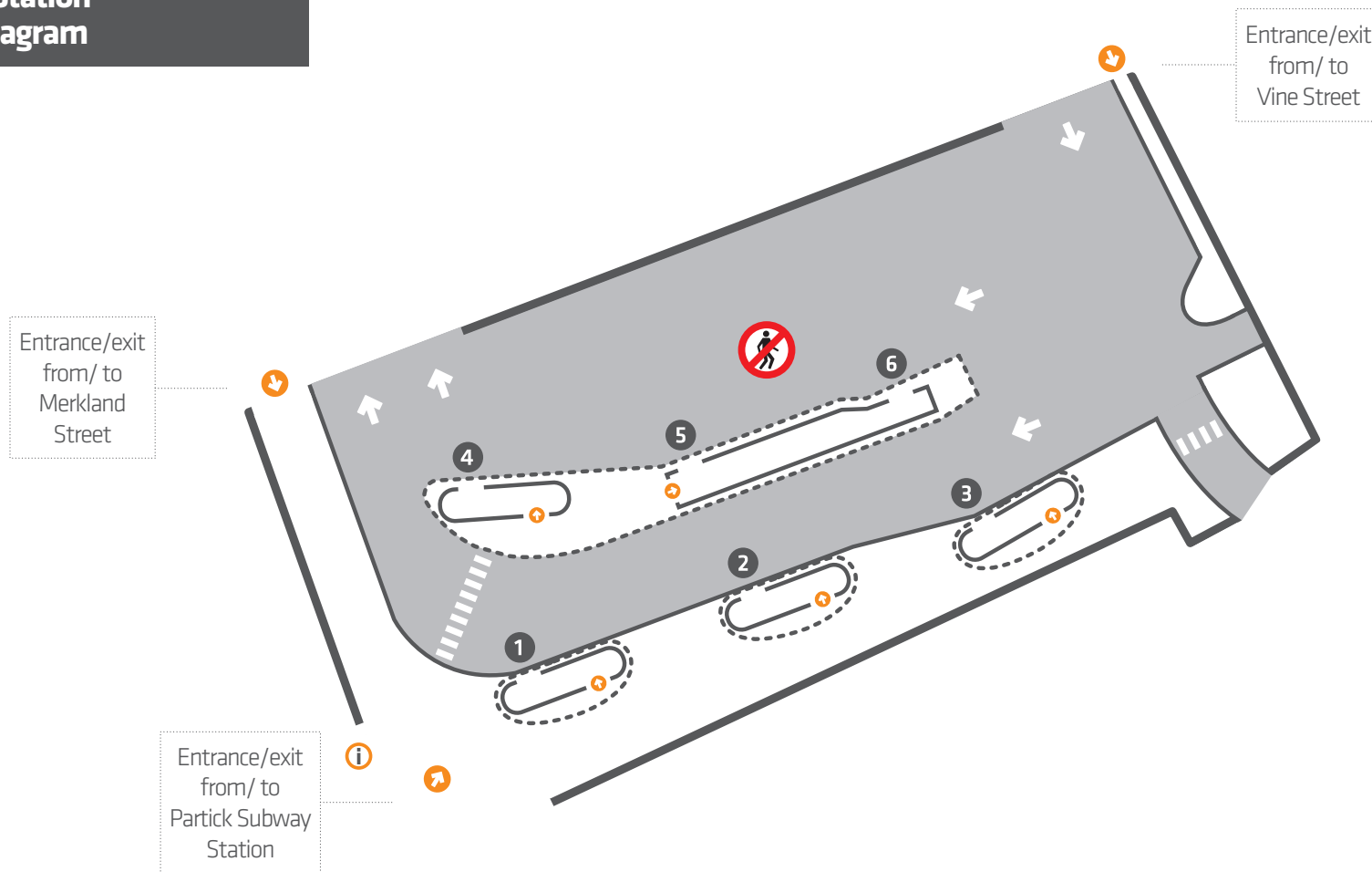
The bus stances and the areas around them can be accessed 24hrs a day, 7 days a week.

Staff presence

There are no staff at this station.

Partick Bus Station concourse description

Arriving at the station

Partick Subway and rail station is located just west of the bus stances. Separate access guides cover these facilities.

The bus station can be accessed on foot from Dumbarton Road via Vine Street or Merkland Street or from Beith Street via a footpath connecting to the large area of public realm between Partick Subway and rail station and Partick bus station.

Railings prevent pedestrians accessing the bus operational area except at bus boarding and pedestrian crossing points.

There is no pedestrian access to the bus station for the west side of Vine Street or the east side of Merkland Street. Uncontrolled pedestrian crossings, with dropped kerbs and blister paving tiles, connect to the opposite pavement.

An uncontrolled pedestrian crossing, with dropped kerbs and blister paving tiles, also provides access to the bus station from Vine Street, across the entrance to supermarket carpark.

There is a 24-hour taxi rank located on the left-hand side of Merkland Street northwest of the bus station.

A map of the station and a list of destinations with departure stance numbers, is located beside the main entrance to Partick Subway and rail station building.

Bus stances

There is level, step free access to all stances and throughout the surrounding area of public realm.

The bus station is formed by two rows of bus stances, with the bus operational area between them.

Stances 1-3 are located beside the Morrisons carpark and are accessed directly from the public realm around the bus station.

Stances 1-4 have individual enclosed shelter areas which are each accessed through an opening back of the shelter, away from the bus boarding point.

Stances 4-6 are on an island platform to the north of stances 1-3. These stances can only be accessed from an uncontrolled pedestrian crossing point. This is located beside stance 1. The crossing point is identified by blister paving tiles, dropped kerbs and gaps in the pedestrian railings.

One enclosed shelter with seating is provided for stances 5 and 6. This is accessed through an opening at the end of the shelter at stance 5. There is no direct access to stance 6. Stance 6 can only be reached through the shelter.

Full seat and perch seating are provided at each stance.

All stances are lit and have talking signs and information screens that give information on the next departure along with details of stance number.

Bus stances

All stances have automatic sliding doors that open when a bus arrives at the stance.

A high kerb on the outside of the doors allows for level boarding of buses.

The sliding doors and fences prevent access to the operational area until a bus arrives at a stance.

Toilets

An accessible toilet is available within the nearby Partick Subway and rail station building.

The toilet is located between the main station entrance and the SPT ticket office. Customers can access this using their RADAR key.

Other information

There is full CCTV coverage throughout the station for the safety and security of all travellers.

There are no facilities for left luggage.

Free WiFi is available when connecting to 'SPT Free WiFi'.

Tickets cannot be purchased at this bus station. All bus tickets should either be purchased in advance through the bus operator or on the vehicle from the driver.
