

Station

A multi-level Subway station near Ibrox Stadium.

Access to the Subway Station is from the corner of Woodville Street and Copeland Road with an entrance from both streets.


The station has two platforms. One to access trains on the Inner circle and the other for trains on the Outer circle.

There are no designated parking facilities available at this station.


There is no designated pick up/set down area at this station.

Access to the ticketing concourse

Level step free access is provided from the Woodville Street and Copland Road entrances.

Ibrox Subway station Ticketing concourse description

Ticketing concourse

The ticket office is in straight ahead from the Copland Road entrance and to the right from the Woodville Street entrance.

Two ticket vending machines are located to the right-hand wall on the approach to the ticket office, after the Woodville Street entrance.

Anti-reflective, slip resistant flooring is provided throughout the station.

White wayfinding tiles in the floor guide passengers to the ticket office and ticket gate-line.

Platform access is via a ticket gate-line with ticket validators. Customers should always touch their ticket on validators when entering or leaving the station.

The ticket gate-line is to the left of the ticket office. The ticket gate-line is made up of five entry gates.

Ticketing concourse

One entry gate is extra wide to aid passengers travelling with mobility aids, young children or bags. This is located at the end of the gate line closest to the ticket office. It is the right-hand gate on entering the station and the left-hand gate on leaving.

Stair or escalator access to platforms

Stairs provide access between the station concourse and the Inner and Outer platforms.

The stairs down to the Inner platform are first on the left on passing through the ticket gate-line.

The stairs down to the Outer platform are second on the left on passing through the ticket gate-line.

There are two flights of stairs leading down to both the Inner and Outer platforms, with a landing between each flight. The lower most flight of stair has 16 steps and the uppermost has 12 steps. This is the same on access to both platforms. A right turn is needed at each landing to reach the next flight.

Stair or escalator access to platforms

All stairs have 30-point colour contrast stair nosing.


Corduroy tactile tiles indicate the bottom and top of each flight of stairs.

All stairs have double height handrails which are non-reflective and not "cold to touch".

Lift access to platforms

There is no lift access to the platforms.

Ibrox Subway station Platform description

Platforms

This station has two platforms. One for the Inner circle trains and one for Outer circle trains.

The stairs for the Inner platform come out at the end of the platform to the front of the train.

The stairs for the Outer platform come out at the end of the platform to the rear of the train.

The train will arrive on the right-hand side when the passenger steps off the stairs onto both the Inner and Outer platforms.

A solid glass wall with a metal handrail provides a solid edge to the back of the Inner platform when the passenger steps off the stairs onto the platform.

Platforms are tiled with anti-reflective, slip resistant tiles.

Blister tactile tiles and white edge marking are provided along the full length of both Inner and Outer platforms, to indicate the platform edge.

Customer information systems display the wait time to next train.

The emergency escape stairs are provided at the end of each platform, at the opposite end from the platform access stairs.

Access between platforms

Access between platforms is via the ticketing concourse only.

Other information

The station is staffed.

An induction loop is provided at the ticket office window.

No public toilet facilities are available.

Wi-Fi is available in the station.

Audio information announcements are made in the station.

No public toilet facilities are available.

This station can be very busy when football matches are being played or other events are taking place at Ibrox Stadium.
