## **Renewal of SPT's Design Technical and Professional Services Framework**

#### Report by Director of Finance & Corporate Support

#### 1. Object of report

The purpose of this report to seek the Partnership's approval to award the renewal of SPT's Design Technical and Professional Services framework and the award of consultancy organisations to the lots within the framework.

#### 2. Background

SPT's Design Technical and Professional Services framework was established in 2013 and was renewed in 2018. This is the third iteration of this framework that SPT are seeking to award. The framework was established to allow SPT the ability to call off professional services (under mini-competition or by direct award for low value commissions), from a pool of consultants that have been financially, economically, legally, technically and commercially evaluated for a range of disciplines and specialised skills in support of the efficient operation of the wide range of project activity within SPT.

The framework remains a necessary business requirement with SPT's continued Subway Modernisation activities and the move forward with project activities driven by the latest Regional Transport Strategy.

#### 3. Outline of proposals

There are nine lots on the framework:

Lot One: Transport Planning Lot Two: Transport Model Development and Application Lot Three: Land Use Planning Consultancy Lot Four: Climate Change Adaptation, Decarbonisation and Energy Efficiency Lot Five: Support for Mainstreaming Equality Duties Lot Six: Mechanical and Electrical Engineering Lot Seven: Civil and Structural Engineering and Design Lot Eight: Rail Engineering Lot Nine: Telecoms and Signalling

The tender objective was to identify technically qualified consultants to deliver the scope of each framework lot and determine their commercial daily rates against a standardised grading structure. To achieve this, an advert for a restricted (two stage) procurement procedure was placed in the Find a Tender Service (FTS) on 15 November 2021, to which Scottish Procurement Document (SPD) responses were received on 16 December 2021. The

SPD responses were evaluated for compulsory and discretionary exclusion based on legal and economic grounds as defined by the procurement regulations and financial thresholds and evidence of experience defined by SPT.

At stage one 25 organisations submitted a total of 63 bids across all lots. Of those 25 organisations, 7 bids were set aside at this stage as they either did not demonstrate experience to be scored sufficiently to be invited to submit a tender or failed SPT's financial checks.

The organisations short-listed through this process were invited to submit a tender on 16 February 2022 with a submission date of 26 April.

The tender responses were evaluated on a Most Economically Advantageous Tender (MEAT) basis being a weighted blend of technical responses (60%) and commercial responses (40%).

In the technical section, tenderers were asked to provide a response to questions under the following structure:

- Methodology
- Quality and Resilience of Personnel
- Risks, Mitigations and Opportunities

The technical responses were evaluated by a cross-section of SPT staff.

In the commercial section, tenderers were asked to provide maximum daily rates inclusive of expenses to a pre-defined grading structure. The commercial evaluation was undertaken by the SPT procurement team.

At this stage (Invitation to Tender) only three bids, all from lot 7 were set aside after the evaluation of the bids.

The appointment proposals are contained at Appendix 1.

#### 4. Conclusion

For the provision of the services defined for each lot of this framework, the organisations listed at Appendix 1 have been evaluated in line with The Public Contracts (Scotland) Regulations 2015.

#### 5. Partnership action

The Partnership is recommended to approve the appointment of the consultancy organisations detailed for each lot to form this iteration of SPT's Design Technical and Professional Services framework.

#### 6. Consequences
