1. Object of report

To seek approval for proposed amendments to the 2023/2024 capital programme and seek approval to Grant Fund as detailed in sections 6(ii) and 6(iii) of this report.

2. Background to report

The 2023/2024 capital budget was approved by the Partnership on 17 March 2023. Subsequently, SPT has been successful in its' application to Transport Scotland under the Regional Active Travel Grant (RATG) fund in support of six capital projects proposed by our local authority partners, totalling £1.040m.

The RATG fund promotes the provision of active travel infrastructure, particularly projects which support cross boundary travel.

3. 2023/2024 Approved capital programme position

Table 1 below provides a summary of the 2023/2024 capital budget as approved by the Partnership on 17 March 2023.

4. Proposed amendments

Six proposed amendments have been received for the 2023/2024 capital programme, all relating to the RATG scheme. These are shown in Appendix 1 of this report and represent an increase of £1.040m in the 2023/2024 capital programme (General Capital).

There is a corresponding increase of £1.040m in the revised 2023/2024 funding contributions (General Capital).

Following approval of the 2023/2024 capital programme on 17 March 2023, the Scottish Government specific capital grant award for Subway Modernisation has been confirmed at £12.882m which is an increase of £0.002m compared to the previously estimated value.

There is a re-profiling of £0.002m in the revised 2023/2024 funding (Subway Modernisation) in relation to the transfer required from the Subway Modernisation Fund.

If the proposed amendments are approved by the Partnership, then the impact on the 2023/2024 programme will be as detailed in Table 2 below.

- (iv) note that further work to quantify and manage risk, advance savings and re-phase existing projects is being undertaken to balance spend against budget.
